

Naming Opportunities

Creating a safe, comfortable, homelike, therapeutic, and reassuring environment is essential to the success of this home. The life stories of the families we work with are inspiring yet tragic. The parents of medically fragile children devote their lives to caring for their child's needs. These needs are greater than most of us can even imagine - hours of physical care and therapies above and beyond those of typical parenting. This home is designed to allow respite breaks for their parents. We are asking for your consideration and support.

The Home @ 500,000

This home will be a safe temporary environment providing an enriching experience for medically fragile and technology dependent children. It will be a 4500 square foot house with six bedrooms nestled in a residential area. The donor who provides \$1,000,000 will be given the opportunity to name this special house, endorsing a legacy of care within our community.

Playground Area @ \$100,000

This pleasing outdoor space will offer children unique possibilities for a wide range of enriching activities. Along with a swing set developed for handicapped children, this play yard will offer a nature trail that allows the wheelchair dependent children to enjoy the outdoors. On the landscaped grounds will be many other pieces of age and developmentally appropriate therapeutic equipment. There will also be a pavilion with electrical and plumbing facilities. A donor who provides \$300,000 will be given the opportunity to name this special outdoor playground area.

The Kitchen @ \$50,000

As any adult knows, the kitchen is the heart of a home. Children will benefit from the enriching interaction, aromas, and tastes that are generated when cooking and baking while sitting around a cozy kitchen table which seats 10. This kitchen will also house highchairs and booster seats for our little ones to use as needed. The table will accommodate wheelchairs. We will also have separate "clean" and "dirty" areas as mandated by state regulations. A donor who provides \$50,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.

Playroom @ \$50,000

Social interaction and sensory stimulation will be the two largest goals of this room. This room will be a child's delight filled with bright colors and toys for play. There will be books to stimulate the imagination, games, and computer activities to help with hand eye coordination. This room will be full of windows allowing for sunshine and a view of the world outside. The playroom will house an entertainment center complete with a VCR

and DVD for playing their favorite movies. Music has a way of healing our souls so this room will also be equipped with tape players and radios and CD players. Most of the furniture will be child sized to help them be as independent as possible. Our volunteers look forward to spending many hours with the children in this large room helping them with all of the developmentally appropriate activities that will be offered. There will be a large sofa and loveseat, easy chair for cuddling, along with end tables, lamps, and floor plants. A donor who provides \$40,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.

Infant Bedroom @ \$25,000

Pastel hues and lullabies will soothe this room's visitors. This bedroom will hold three baby cribs with color coordinated nightstands and lamps. Over stuffed rockers and changing tables will make this room complete. Little ones will enjoy spending time in this decorated room and the loving arms of their caretakers. This room will have a built in audio/video monitor for safety. A donor who provides \$30,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.

Toddler Bedroom @ \$25,000

One bed for this room has already been donated by a family from Bristol, in memory of their son. This is a special bed made with padded rails and netting around the sides so that an active child will not hurt himself. Along with the Vail bed there will be two toddler beds, nightstands, and lamps. A child friendly theme will help this room be a fun place to stay. This room will have a built in audio/video monitor. A donor who provides \$35,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.

School Age Bedrooms @ \$25,000 (each)

There will be two bedrooms, each with two hospital beds and a special lift to allow for safe transfer of the children from wheelchair to bed. One of these rooms will be decorated for young ladies and the other for young gentlemen. These school age and/or adolescent children will feel as though they were on a vacation in a hotel when they come to stay in this home. These rooms will also have built in audio/video systems for monitoring the children. A donor who provides \$70,000 will be given the opportunity to name these two rooms.

The Quiet Room @ \$25,000

One bedroom will be dedicated to the child who requires a calm and serene atmosphere for his or her own control. Since some of our children have a heightened sensitivity and are easily agitated to sensory stimulation, this room will be designed to promote comfort, peace and tranquility. This space will also be decorated as a quiet space for prayer, meditation, or reflection that is always a necessary part of any health care setting or

home. This room will have an audio/video system so that the nurses may monitor the child's well being without physically disturbing him or her. A donor who provides \$25,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.

Meeting / Training Room @ \$50,000

This room will be equipped with audio-visual equipment, computer, Internet access, conference call capabilities, and a library. A large banquet table that seats twelve will be utilized for board meetings and family conferences. As a regular part of the mission of the O'Hana Heritage Foundation, Inc, educational days will be offered to schoolteachers for instruction about children's chronic disease processes (e.g. seizures, genetic disorders of their students, traumatic brain injuries, etc). We will offer intermittent "camp" days for children to increase their independence with illnesses such as asthma management, cerebral palsy, diabetes, and cystic fibrosis. A donor who provides \$25,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.

Parent Library @ \$30,000

Built in bookcases and shelving will hold medical, parenting, and reference books for parents to utilize whenever needed. A facsimile/copy machine and two computers with Internet access will be at the parents' disposal in this room. Two desk chairs will allow the families comfort as they may spend hours looking up articles or talking by chat room with other families with similar conditions. A 36 inch round table and four small upholstered chairs will create an intimate area for parents' sharing and conversation. Several lamps will provide adequate lighting, but allow the room to remain cozy. A donor who provides \$25,000 will be given the opportunity to name this room.
